

Repent and believe in the Good News

Today is the first Sunday of Lent. I feel a great sense of excitement and anticipation for the first time. I have set resolutions to be more focused on the Lord during this season, something that I never consciously commit to do in the past. Perhaps, I was always doing stuff and not sitting still by being.

This year, I choose to declutter my mind, free myself from the distractions of social media and endeavour to spend more time with the Lord. I realise that my life was just too full of things, that I find it challenging to listen to His voice.

Like the first reading from Genesis, God spoke to Noah and told him that He had already established a Covenant with us, "no flood shall destroy the earth again". But we choose our own floods all the time when He just wants to save us.

This is echoed by the second reading from 1 Peter:

"That water is a type of the baptism which saves you now, and which is not the washing off of physical dirt but a pledge made to God from a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has entered heaven and is at God's right hand, now that he has made the angels and Dominations and Powers his subjects." 300 Thomson Road, Singapore 307653

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All God wants is our pledge to Him from a good conscience. It calls for us to reflect and search deep within ourselves, to cross-examine our relationship with God so that we can enjoy the Good News every day of our lives.

To do that. He has given us the Sacrament of Reconciliation which is truly a gift. I confess that I did not fully understand and appreciate the power of this Sacrament till recently. God does not need us to confess to Him but He has given us this opportunity to do so, so that we can understand more deeply His compassion and mercy. I realise that being humble to realise that I have sinned and having the discipline to approach the Sacrament of Reconciliation on a more regular basis has helped my spiritual iourney. It has strengthened me to embrace my daily trials with a more cheerful disposition.

Indeed, when Jesus proclaimed in the gospel of Mark: 'The time has come and the kingdom of God is close at hand. Repent, and believe the Good News', the time is now. There is no better time than now for a renewal of spirit and mind, to prepare ourselves during this Holy season.
