Jesus Gives Eternal Life

The theme for our Lenten Novena this year is "Jesus gives eternal life." In the seven signs from the Gospel of John that we reflected upon. Jesus Christ is present with people through their struggles in life. The couple at Cana had run out of wine - our lives are starved of joy. The cripple man at the pool of Bethesda has waited 38 years for healing - we suffer the pain of illness, 5000 people have no food - millions in our world today face poverty and hunger. Martha and Mary mourn the loss of their brother Lazarus - death remains the ultimate question that leaves us in despair and emptiness.

In the Gospel of Easter Sunday, we are told the disciples 'had failed to understand the teaching of Scripture, that he must rise from the dead.' When we are suffering. when there is no joy, when we are sick, when we are hungry and when we face the loss of death, we can give in to despair. Maybe God has abandoned us and there is no hope. The resurrection of Jesus and our celebration of Easter is a reminder of the hope our faith gives us. The Exsultet proclaims: 'This is the night, when Jesus Christ broke the chains of death and rose triumphant from the arave.' Jesus Christ has transformed our despair into hope and our death into the fullness of eternal life - this is the heart of our faith.

In the Acts, Peter tells Cornelius that we are witnesses to this faith. To how Jesus lived, what he taught, how he died and how God raised him from the dead. The Easter Vigil began with the Service of Light. The Easter candle, the light of Christ, is carried into the darkness of the church and our lives. As we receive the light of Christ, we pass that light to others, and soon, the darkness is overcome by the light. The Risen Christ has transformed our sadness into jov. has healed our illness, has filled our emptiness and hunger and in the face of death, has given us hope of eternal life. We are witnesses to that. Here at Novena Church, our mission is to be witnesses to the healing, hope and life that the Risen Christ brings.

After the resurrection of Jesus how can life be the same again? In our suffering, sickness, hunger and even death, there is hope.

After the resurrection of Jesus - how can death be the same again? It is not the end, but a beginning of a fuller and eternal life. The Lord is Risen - Alleluia.
