We are coming to the end of the liturgical year. The readings typically point to what we would expect at end times when judgement is meted out.

Take heart, it is not gloom and doom. It reminds us that we have to account ourselves to the Sovereign One, Our God at the end of the day. The first reading from Daniel tells us that people 'whose names are written in the Book will be spared'. Who are these people? Will I be one of them?

The reading alludes to the 'learned' and 'those who have instructed many in virtue", that they will shine 'as bright as stars for all eternity'. These are people who have understood and learnt to walk in the ways of the Lord and guided others to do the same.

Do we fall under this category? Or are we still "unlearnable" or refused to learn. It takes a lot of conviction to want to learn and practise anything seriously. Where do we invest our time? The social media is a world of distractions and also possibilities. We can choose to focus on what is important to us. It can be a wonderful resource. For example, the youtube channel gives us access to the live telecast of daily masses. If we want to learn more about our faith to be ready for the Lord when He comes, resources are abound.

We do not know when Judgement Day would come. This is resonated in the gospel reading from Mark:

'But as for that day or hour, nobody knows it, neither the angels of heaven nor the Son: no one but the Father.'

It is in our interest to prepare ourselves. We should not wait for signs or stars falling from heaven to jolt us into action. Let us act now. If we do not know where to start, ask the Holy Spirit to guide us. As long as it is a good thing, just trust and go with the flow. If someone invites you to a healing rally, just go. If another suggests that you go for a retreat, just go. It is not necessary to think too much or evaluate whether we are worthy/prepared.

Remember Zacchaeus, the tax collector who was a short man who climbed up a sycamore tree just to 'check out' Jesus? Our Lord looked up and called him by name, asked him to come down as He wanted to visit his home. Some of us are like Zacchaeus, plain curious and probably thinking that we can hide and just peek. But our Lord knows, calls us and wants to visit our hearts.

God will guide you once you accept the invitation. It is through these encounters that we learn more about the goodness of the Lord and let Him mould us more into his likeness so that we can prepare well to meet Him when the day comes.
