

Christ is Coming – Christ is Here

Some of us know what it's like to plan a wedding. We have to plan for the church and the liturgy, we have to send out invitations and process the RSVPs, the reception needs to be organised, guests need to be accommodated, and many other things. Many couples start making plans a year or more before their wedding.

Advent has begun and we have twenty-three days to prepare for Christmas! Advent serves two purposes. First, it is an immediate preparation for Christmas, and secondly, it is a reminder to be prepared for the time when Christ will come again.

It's difficult enough to prepare for an event when we know how much time we have. What if we do not even know when it is going to happen? In today's Gospel, Jesus says: 'There will be signs in the sun and moon and stars. Men dying of fear as they await what menaces the world. And they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory.'

The early Christians believed that Jesus Christ would return shortly and the end of the world was near. They called it the parousia. So, they prepared themselves and didn't waste time on anything "worldly." They believed that the day would come soon, but they did not know exactly when. As they waited, weeks became months and months became years. Finally, they realized that the end times were not as imminent as they had imagined and they had to get on with the responsibilities of daily life.

How can we decipher the signs hidden in the sun, and moon and stars? The signs of Christ's "coming" are everywhere. Christ is already here! Christ is present in our hearts, in the people that we love and in the community of faith. Christ is everywhere in our lives.

The early Christian community came to the realization that their faith was not only about waiting for Christ to return, but to recognize Christ present in their current circumstances and the people around them.

Advent is an opportunity to spend more time in prayer, to examine our lives and to show more love to the people around us. We do not know when Christ will come again, but we do know for certain that Christ in present here and now. When we recognize Christ in our midst, then we are prepared for his coming.

Advent is here!

The word "advent" comes from a Latin term referring to the coming of an emperor or a king. But, we are awaiting the coming of Someone greater than any earthly ruler. Advent is a time we reflect on the coming of Jesus at two distinct times. First, we remember his birth in Bethlehem - the time God fulfilled the promise to send us a Saviour. It is also a time for us to wait in hope for the Second Coming of Jesus in glory. Our Advent Wreath is steeped in symbolism. The violet colour of the three candles reminds us of the spiritual preparation we need to make during this holy time. The rose coloured candle symbolises the joy we ought to have as we wait for the birthday of Jesus. The white candle stands for the presence of Jesus amongst us as the Light of the World. The evergreens and the unending circle of the wreath help us call to mind the eternal life that Jesus offers us.
