Thus, the words in the first reading from Isaiah resonate with me – "Listen to me that you may have life", "seek the Lord while he may be found, call upon him while he is near".

Indeed, I was seeking Him desperately. There was a call to join the RCIA during my second novena session. I took the form and made a bargain with God. I asked Him to provide my family with a home and I would sign up for the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) programme. Desperate as I was, my family could not find a suitable place to stay and it was nearing the RCIA signup deadline. By a leap of faith, I faxed the form over to the church office on that Thursday and on Sunday, we found the place where the family would stay for the next 20 years of our lives!

I began my faith journey with many questions and physical obstacles impeded me from attending the RCIA regularly. The community was patient, understanding, reassuring and caring. Solemnity of The Most Holy Redeemer



The seal of the Congregation consists of a cross with a lance and sponge mounted on three hills. The crown over the coat of arms can be interpreted as the crown of glory that is the reward for persevering in the Congregation.

Around the seal is the motto, which translates into English, as "With Him there is Plentiful Redemption." It is based on Psalm 129/130. It speaks of what binds all Redemptorists under an honourable coat of arms that is centered on Jesus Christ, the Redeemer and under the protection of Mary.
