

God's Redemption is a Gift for Everyone

In the Gospel today, Jesus sends out seventy-two disciples to preach the Good News. What is the Good News? Today's readings from the prophet Isiah and Paul's letter to the Galatians can help us reflect on the message.

It seems to be human nature that we include those who are like ourselves and exclude those who are different. We tend to stick with those who speak the same language, are part of the same culture and share similar values. In some ways, that is normal. but in another way, it can become exclusive.

In the church, this poses a real challenge to building community. In the early church, especially in the church of Galatia, the Christians who came from a Jewish background believed that those who were not Jews should first be circumcised before they could be baptised as Christians. The Gentiles felt like second-class members in the church. The tensions between Jews and Gentiles within the Galatian church now threatened to destroy the whole Christian community, and with it, the faith of its members.

Paul's teaching is clear: 'It does not matter if a person is circumcised or not; what matters is for him to become an altogether new creature.' Jesus Christ, by his Incarnation, life. death and resurrection has redeemed us. A redemption that we have not deserved, much less earned. And because none of us in the church has earned this redemption, we are all equal. God's redemption is a gift for evervone.

Chapter 66 is the last chapter of the book of Isaiah, written when the Israelites returned to Jerusalem after their exile in Babylon. It must have been such a relief and joy for the exiles to return to their homeland. However. the return was not without problems. Conflict arose between those who had been exiled and those who had remained behind. There were disputes over land as the returnees wanted their old land back.

Isaiah however, is focused on God's salvation. He believed that salvation would first be offered to a "remnant" the anawim, the people of the Holy City of Jerusalem. However, it is not exclusive. It is a symbol and a promise of a universal salvation in the future. where all people will be welcome to experience the redemption of God. God's redemption is a gift for evervone.

Often, we get carried away with squabbles and disagreements but we must be focused on our mission to share the Good News. That with God. there is plentiful redemption for all. Isaiah and Paul remind us that the Christian community is called to be a place where people come to experience this redemption.
