Today, the Catholic Church celebrates the Nativity of Mary. Happy Birthday Mother Mary!

This church has a special devotion to Mother Mary. The Novena sessions are packed every Saturday, and several thousand came last Sunday for the Annual Procession, Lattend the Saturday Novenas and as L sit through the 8am Novena sessions. I listen attentively to the petitions and letters of Thanksgiving. Invariably, the number of petitions is way more than the number of Thanksgiving letters. So it appears that we petition more than we thank. Leaving that aside, the petitions are all valid and earnest, and the letters of Thanksgiving are sweet with gratitude. But I do not recall many letters where the writers had thanked Mary even though their petitions were NOT answered. So what happens when the petitions are not answered or answered in wav we expected? Will the Novena Devotions stop?

I reflected on the following quote: Love the Giver, more than the gift. (Brigham Young) For every parent, grandparent or teacher who has ever received a crudely handmade gift or card from a little child, you know that the gift is secondary. You look straight at the love of the little child who made and offered the gift and card to you, and you love back. So when our petitions are answered, do we love Mother Mary and her Son Jesus for the gift? Or, is our joy focused on the gift we received? And do we love only while there are still

gifts to be received? The test is whether we can still love when our petitions are not answered or not answered in the way we had prayed. This calls for true faith and devotion.

I think that there is no greater way to show our love, faith and devotion than to be thankful. At times, I take my faith for granted – *No worries, God will understand.* I need to be more grateful that I have Jesus, and his mother in my life and faith journey. And I need to show my gratitude and heartfelt thanks by praising the Lord for not just what he has done, but for who he is. My God is wonderful!

So on this special day and as we sit in this Church and before the Shrine of Our Mother of Perpetual Help, let us first recall the many blessings we have received through her intercession. Thank you. Mother Mary. Let us then thank God for the many blessings we have received through Mother Mary's intercession. And let us each thank God by sharing with Mother Mary her prayer of praise and thanksgiving to God by praying the Magnificat silently: "My soul glorifies the Lord, my Spirit rejoices in God my Saviour. He looks on His servant in her nothingness; Henceforth all ages will call me blessed. The Almighty works marvels for me. Holy is His name!"

We thank you, and your Son, Jesus! Help us to love you and your Son more. Happy Birthday, Mother Mary!
