

Stay Awake and Stand Ready

Once again, we begin a new liturgical year with the season of Advent. The word Advent comes from the Latin, *advenire*, which means 'to come.' Unlike Lent, the season of Advent does not have a purely penitential character but is rather one of preparation and expectation. As we prepare to celebrate the feast of the Lord's Nativity, we remember how God once came into our world to share our lives, and we wait in expectation for the time that he will come again.

Today, we live in a world that is in a precarious state. War and violence are all around. We are told that we have to maintain our vigilance against forces that seek to harm us. We also realize that our lifestyle causes irreparable damage to our planet. As we go about our daily business, unencumbered by any concerns, we never imagine anything bad will happen to us. We are used to seeing things happen to other people on the news. But we never know. While we enjoy our lives, we also live in fear.

The people of Jesus' time, lived in the strong belief that the world could come to an end soon. The first generation of Christians believed that Jesus would come again very soon. Next week perhaps! They called it the *parousia*. Eventually, they realized that the end times were not as imminent as they had imagined and some began to "get on with their lives", some went back to the lifestyle they had before and the urgency of their conversion was forgotten.

We do not know when Christ will come again. But Paul reminds the Romans, it is nearer now than it was last year. Of that, we can be certain. The season of Advent is a time for us to renew our commitment of faith in Jesus Christ and our belief that one day we will see him and for that we must be prepared.

Advent calls us to prayer, to examine our lives and to show more love to the people around us. We do not know when Christ will come again, but we do know for certain that Christ in present here and now. When we recognize Christ in our brothers and sisters, then we are prepared for his coming.
