

The Journey to Bethlehem

Today, we light the Second Candle of Advent, which is also known as the Bethlehem Candle. This candle symbolises Faith and Love, and also recalls the preparations Mary and Joseph made for Jesus' birth.

While they were getting ready for Jesus' birth, they were interrupted by a Roman census to be taken of the entire Roman world. Everyone had to go to their own town to register. St Luke writes: "Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David." (Luke 2: 1-7). Joseph brought Marv with him, and from their point of view, the 90-mile (or, 145 km) journey was surely an inconvenience. Mary was nearing the end of her pregnancy, and they would have preferred to stay at Nazareth, rather than spend the better part of a week traveling from Nazareth to Bethlehem. But. that's not how God saw it.

About 800 years earlier, God had spoken to His people through the Prophet Micah: "But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are small among the clans of Judah, out of you will come for me one who will be ruler over Israel, whose origins are from of old, from ancient times." (Micah 5:2)

The amazing thing is that when the time was right, God's plan of Salvation fell into place and in total fulfillment of the ancient prophecy as to where the Promised Messiah was to be born. Nazareth, but God wanted Jesus to be born in Bethlehem. So God used a Roman emperor to decree a census to accomplish His purposes; and Jesus was born where God had promised.

We do not appreciate interruptions to our plans at any time, and we especially hate interruptions when we are at our busiest. But. sometimes God interrupts our plans in order to accomplish His purposes. It may not be convenient, and sometimes, it may be downright, uncomfortable. So, as we get ready for Christmas and the New Year. let us not get so wrapped up in our own preparations that we are too busy to appreciate what God is doing in our lives and in the lives of those around us. Is God interrupting my plans because he wants me to do something else, or to do something for someone else?

The Second Candle of Advent reminds me that Christmas is the celebration of our faith in Jesus the Christ. Christmas is also about Love. So, my plans for this Christmas is to celebrate my love for God and for the people around me.

"Do not be afraid; for see - I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord." (Luke 2:10-11)

Feast of Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, 9 December

In 1854, Pope Pius IX's solemn declaration, *Ineffabilis Deus* clarified with finality the long-held belief of the Church that Mary was conceived free from original sin. In proclaiming the Immaculate Conception of Mary as a dogma of the Church, the pope expressed precisely and clearly that Mary was conceived free from the stain of original sin. This privilege of Mary derives from God having chosen her as Mother of the Savior; thus she received the graces of salvation in Christ from the very moment of her conception.



This great gift to Mary, an ordinary human being just like us, was fitting because she was destined to be Mother of God. The purity and holiness of the Blessed Virgin Mary is a model for all Christians.


