

Another Year, Another Chance

"Then he told this parable: "A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard; and he came looking for fruit on it and found none. So he said to the gardener, 'See here! For three years I have come looking for fruit on this fig tree, and still I find none. Cut it down! Why should it be wasting the soil?' He replied, 'Sir, let it alone for one more year, until I dig around it and put manure on it. If it bears fruit next year, well and good; but if not, you can cut it down." (Luke 13:6-9).

The Parable of the Barren Fig Tree is not the Gospel Reading for this Sunday. Yet, this parable provides a timely reflection as we end 2017 and wait to usher 2018! God the Father in Heaven is the owner of the vineyard. He is disappointed that for three vears, there was still no fruit on the fig tree. The disappointment was great because God himself had planted the fig tree and he had surely planted with the hope of bountiful growth. The gardener is of course Jesus. The reference to "three years" is significant because that was the period of Jesus' public ministry before his passion and crucifixion. Jesus would likewise be disappointed that the Jewish people of his time did not heed his call to repent and return to God. While the people clamoured for miracles and healings, they did not really want to change their lives. They did not want to do as Jesus had commanded - to love, forgive and serve.

But Jesus did not give up on us. He was not prepared for any of us to be cut down and thrown away. He still had hope in us. He persuades the Father to give one more year.

Jesus further promises the Father that he will continue to work on the fig tree. Jesus is prepared to invest his time and energy in us to ensure that each one of us will bear fruit, and live lives pleasing to the Father.

I am grateful that Jesus persuaded the Father to give me another day of life. More time where I can, with Jesus' presence in my life, become the person God wants me to be. So I examine critically the areas in my life that I have yet to bear fruit. Two points struck me. First, the areas that I need to change were the "same sins" that I confess each time I go to Confession. I need to get rid of these "same sins". Secondly, the areas that I needed to do better had all related to relationships – at home and at work.

Since we are celebrating the Feast of the Holy Family this Sunday, I have decided to focus on improving my relationship with each of my family members. I look to the Holy Family as the perfect example of mutual love and respect.
