## Who Else.. but Jesus?

*"I am the Bread of Life."*

This Sunday's Gospel follows last Sunday's Gospel and will carry on for a further two weeks. In these four weeks, we read Chapter 6 of St John's Gospel where Jesus reveals his Divinity and his message: Jesus is the Living Bread and he offers Eternal Life to those who hunger and thirst. So if we accept his message of love, forgiveness and service, we will experience Peace, Joy, Hope and Love. And his promise - to be with us always; to nourish, refresh, renew and strengthen. And his promise is made true in the miracle of the Holy Eucharist, where bread becomes his Body and wine becomes his Blood.

We hear how the people listening to this message were disturbed and complained about Jesus and his claims. In the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday's Gospel, we will hear how many of the followers of Jesus left him and stopped going with him: *"This is intolerable language. How could anyone accept it?"*

Jesus then turns to the Twelve: *"What about you, do you want to go away too?"* Peter then gives the most affirming response - ever: *"Lord, who shall we go to? You have the message of eternal life, and we believe, we know that you are Holy One of God."* Unlike his response to Jesus' other question, *"Who do you say I am?"*, which Jesus declares was revealed to Peter by the God the Father himself, this response is one based on the knowledge and belief of Peter and the rest of the Apostles.

The Twelve have been with Jesus throughout. They have experienced Jesus' friendship. They have seen Jesus' interaction with the many people. They witnessed his love, mercy and compassion. They have been awe-struck by his miracles and his power over nature, and even, death.

The Apostles did not understand everything. They struggled with the message behind Jesus' many Parables and they discussed among themselves what it means to "rise from the dead". But having experienced love, peace, joy and hope of being with Jesus and knowing him, Peter responds on behalf of his fellow Apostles: Lord, we have seen your character and your works, and we like you and trust you. We are not willing to leave you. We want to stick with you. We cannot quit because there is no one else like you, Jesus!

So too when we are faced with a difficult doctrine of Christianity, a challenging teaching of the Church, or a crisis in our life. When we are in doubt and despair, Jesus asks us the same question - *"What about you, do you want to go away too?"*

Having experienced the love and mercy of God in our lives, may we each respond with a resounding 'NO'! No, we are not going away. We will stick with you. We will not give up because there is no one else like you, Jesus. You are the Holy One of God! You are the Bread of Life!
