

When Friends Become Enemies

There is a German proverb that goes like this: "Better an honest enemy than a false friend." King Saul and David were once the best of friends. Jealousy and fear. however, turned them into deadly enemies. In fact, it was Saul who became jealous and afraid of David because David was growing in popularity and strength. Saul took three thousand soldiers to hunt down David who had to run into the wilderness to save his life. At night David crept into Saul's camp and stood over him as he slept. The ruthless Abishai instigated David: Today God has put your enemy in your power; so now let me pin him to the ground with his own spear. Just one stroke! I will not need to strike him twice. David put a stop to that. He had the chance to kill his enemy, but he didn't.

This incident provides the basis for us to understand Jesus' radical teaching found in today's Gospel: Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who treat you badly.

From a human stance this is near impossible. The moment a friend betrays us or turns against us, our instinct is to react in a similar way as the vengeful Abishai did. He wanted to pin Saul to the ground with a spear. We know how it feels when a friend becomes an enemy.

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Our hearts become cold and hard and bitter. We lose the capacity to love, to be compassionate, to be merciful. We unleash immediately one of the deadliest weapons we have in our possession. Not a sharp spear, but a treacherous tongue. Our words can cause irreparable harm and irrevocable damage.

This is why Jesus calls on us, as his disciples, to use our words to bless and to pray for those who curse us or treat us badly. The amount we measure out in all that we do and say will be the amount we'll get back in return.

They may have become enemies yet David recognized in Saul the person God had anointed to be the king. David did not raise his hand against Saul because he had an upright and loyal heart. He was an honest enemy.

Here are some questions for our reflection:

Do we have enemies? Who are they? Why are they?

Have we ever found ourselves, like David, in a position to do harm but realized we had the grace to love, the strength to be compassionate, the power to be merciful, the wisdom to pray or the ability to bless our enemies?
