

The Good Shepherd, the Good Sheep

In the Middle East, shepherds herd small flocks of sheep over the desert looking for green grass to pasture and water to drink. Sometimes when a shepherd leads his flock to an oasis to drink, he will find other shepherds with their flocks. The shepherd joins the others but he does not segregate his flock from the others. Co-mingled. all the sheep graze, drink and rest together. But when one shepherd decides to leave, he gets up, calls his sheep and walks on. His sheep, hearing their shepherd's voice. disentangle, get up and dutifully trot behind him. The shepherd walks ahead, confident that his sheep recognise his voice and will follow him.

Today is Good Shepherd Sunday. In the Gospel, Jesus declares: "My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life ...". I am grateful to my Good Shepherd who knows me and has called me to be his sheep, his disciple.

Jesus is confident that his sheep will hear his voice and follow him. But, are we good sheep? Do we always recognise Jesus' voice? Do we then respond to his voice, accept his will in our lives, and follow our Good Shepherd? Most of the times, we fail to hear his voice in the people around and in our present situations. We are too busy or distracted doing what we feel we have to do. Other times, we are too busy 'butting heads' with other sheep, and are caught up in petty squabbles and disagreements.

Yet other times, we may have just have 'switched off'. And when we fail to recognise Jesus' voice, we do not respond to his call. As we do not pick ourselves up and follow behind him, we are then left behind. We will become the 'lost sheep' that the Good Shepherd will then come looking to find and lead us back.

But fortunately, there is another equally fascinating phenomenon about sheep. When some sheep, and especially lambs, do not heed the voice of their shepherd, the other sheep, which have heard the call, will nudge or call the errant or distracted ones to follow the shepherd. They look out for each other because they know each other and know they all belong to this shepherd's flock.

As today is also Vocation Sunday, let's remember the people in our lives who have taught us our faith in Jesus Christ. May there be more priestly and religious vocations in Singapore and throughout, so that they can bring the Good News to those who have not heard and encourage others to respond to voice of the Good Shepherd.

Finally, as we also celebrate Mother's Day today, let's lift in prayer, our grandmothers, mothers and all caregivers who had tended to us with love and care. I thank the Lord especially for my mother and all mothers who have taught and shared their faith with us, their children. The Lord is the Good Shepherd, may we be his good sheep!

Vocation - It Begins With Me

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is also known as Good Shepherd Sunday. It can be easy on an occasion like this to "ask the Lord to send more labourers to the harvest," to lament the diminishing number of people joining seminaries and religious life or to paint a dire picture of a church without ministers. To pray for vocations is to do much more than this. It is not to ask the Lord to send others but it is a chance to reflect on how we ourselves, our families and our Christian community live the faith.

A religious vocation is nurtured within a Christian community by families, teachers, catechists, youth leaders, friends, priests and religious. All of us are shepherds - to our children, our parents, the people in our community and beyond.

Vocation Sunday challenges all of us to be like Jesus the Good Shepherd, to be servants to one another. A life of service, inspired by our faith serves as an example to young people. And when service becomes a value and a way of life, vocations to serve the community and to the priesthood and consecrated life will follow. The Redemptorists are called to follow the example of Jesus, the Redeemer, by sharing the Good News with the most abandoned especially the poor.
