Personally speaking, I can see the difference. I was brought up in an environment where there was much fear and superstition. There was always talk about "offending spirits" and bad luck. It was deemed as a taboo to attend a wake and a wedding within the same week. My parents even created a door in our home for good fengshui. Hospital was a place of disease and germs. There were a lot of things to avoid to avert bad luck. Looking back, it was a miserable life of fear and restraint.

When I became a Catholic and understood that God reigns supreme, these shackles of the past were removed. I felt free, free to love and be there for the people who needed care and support. I was assured that all acts of love and charity are anchored on Jesus.


