The second reading from the letter of St James teaches us how to prepare for the Lord's coming clearly. It tells us to be patient and not lose heart, not to complain against one another. These instructions appear so simple. But we know that it is not easy to live it up.

Personally, I feel much challenged this week. Two of my friends are ill, one has been admitted to the hospital and the other is waiting to do further tests to determine her condition. The preliminary prognosis is not good. I do feel a little disheartened as I have been praying for their healing but their health appeared to take a downward spiral. I know that the only way is to be patient, not lose heart, to keep the faith and continue praying. 3rd Sunday of Advent

"Rejoice: the Lord is near." As Christmas draws closer, the Church emphasizes the joy which should be in our hearts over all that the birth of our Savior means for us. The great joy of Christians is to see the day when the Lord will come again in His glory to lead us into His kingdom. The oft-repeated Veni ("Come") of Advent is an echo not only of the prophets but also of the conclusion of the Apocalypse of St. John: "Come, Lord Jesus," the last words of the New Testament.

Today is known as "Gaudete Sunday". The term "Gaudete" refers to the first word of the Entrance Antiphon, "Rejoice". Rose vestments are worn to remind us of the joy that Christmas is near. We light the rose candle on our Advent wreath – the candle of Joy.
