

To Be The Light of Christ

40 days after Christmas, the Church celebrates the feast of the Presentation of the Lord. Over the years, this feast has had many makeovers - different emphases, symbols and even different names. We could look at four major themes today.

First of all, it commemorates Jesus' Presentation in the Temple. The Jewish belief was that every firstborn male belonged to the Lord. At the Exodus, all first-born Egyptian males died in the plague and the firstborn Israelites were saved. And so, the Jewish practice was that firstborn sons had to be 'redeemed' and consecrated with an offering of two turtledoves or pigeons.

Secondly, the mother was "purified" after her period of confinement. One time, this feast was called the Feast of the Purification of Mary. These days, the focus is placed on Jesus' consecration instead.

Third, there is the traditional blessing of candles and so this feast was called the Feast of Candlemas. The tradition began with reference to the canticle of Simeon, known in Latin as the *Nunc Dimittis*. Simeon prophesies that Jesus will be 'a light to enlighten the pagans.' Finally, this feast is designated by the Church as the Day for Consecrated Life. Mary, Joseph, Simeon and Anna, are all seen as examples of obedience and chastity and are put forward as examples of how religious are called to consecrate themselves to the Lord.

Luke mentions four times that Mary and Joseph came to the Temple to do what the Law required. For them, this is not just an obligation, they find joy in living their lives according to God's will. Mary, Joseph, Simeon and Anna, and of course, Jesus himself – are an example not only to religious and consecrated people, they are an example to all Christians. They invite us to present ourselves to the Lord, and to be open to the Holy Spirit.

How? Our Orthodox brothers and sisters call this feast the *hypapante* – the Feast of the Encounter. When Jesus is brought to the Temple, he is revealed as the Christ and Messiah. It is the first encounter between the Redeemer and the people. The candles that we will bless are symbols of how each of us – in our own vocation and state of life – are called to share the light of Christ with others, and to bring people to an encounter with Christ. At our baptism, we were all presented to the Lord. May Christians everywhere bear the light of Christ in the world.




